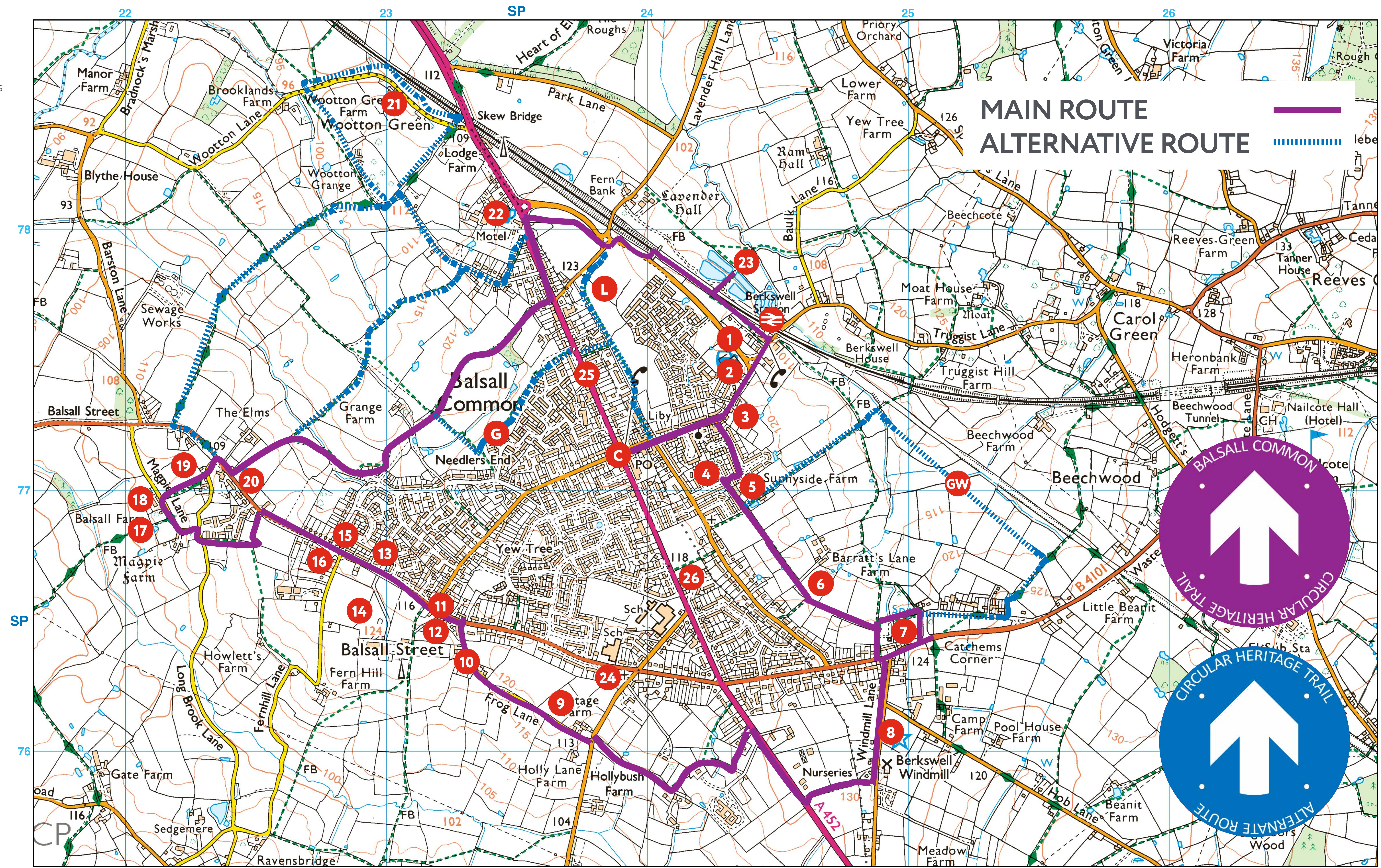


- C** Central Balsall Common – note the locally listed Graeco-Roman style former bank by the roundabout
- R** Berkswell Railway station opened in 1853
- L** Lavender Hall Park – an area for recreation, ecology and sports
- G** Grange Park – an area for recreation and ecology
- GW** The Kenilworth Greenway Solid underfoot
- 1** Railway Inn – previously a Great Western Railways Hotel dating from Victorian times
- 2** Brickmakers Arms a 17th century pub. Clay was dug from the land around the pub to make bricks
- 3** Old Berkswell Store and to its left a former butcher's shop/abattoir which served the community 100 years ago as part of a centre near the station
- 4** Sunnyside House – built in 1763 and the location of a grisly murder in Victorian times
- 5** Sunnyside Farmhouse a brick timber framed cottage and Pool Orchard a listed building set back from the road
- 6** Barratt's Lane Farm House and barn – listed buildings constructed with oak frames set with converted barns
- 7** Medieval fields where you can still see the ridges and furrows
- 8** Berkswell Windmill – Listed building constructed in 1826
- 9** Cottage Farm – listed building
- 10** The Grange – Listed building with cafe adjacent to the left
- 11** Old Forge, old Wheelwrights and Fernhill Court. These formed part of another old centre for the "Balsall Common area"
- 12** Hobbe Cottage – Listed building
- 13** Oakes Farm shop and cafe
- 14** Shenstone Grange – Listed building
- 15** Wisteria Cottage – Listed building
- 16** Magpie Farm – Listed building
- 17** Balsall Farm – Listed building
- 18** Templars Cottage – Listed building
- 19** Saracen's Head – public house dating from 17th century. A listed building
- 20** Blythe Prior – a timber framed and thatched listed building. 100 metres further on are Brooklands Barn and adjoining house and Wootton Green Farm
- 21** George in the Tree. A historic inn that served travellers using the drovers' road and later toll road that is now the Kenilworth Road
- 22** The Fisheries – A café overlooking fishing lakes
- 23** St Peter's Church dating from 1871
- 24** House built in the style of the Arts and Crafts movement
- 25** White Horse Inn. The current building replaced an earlier cottage style pub

BALSALL COMMON HERITAGE TRAIL

The circular walk, following the main purple trail, is about 8 miles or 13 km in length.
