Welly Walk

This trail is a natural unsurfaced and uneven footpath, and it can get very muddy in parts especially at the Wetlands Area!

Wellington or walking boots are recommended, and please do take care whilst thoroughly enjoying your walk!



Sensory Walk

Have you tried out our new Sensory Walk? It allows you to use your senses to connect with your surroundings whilst you stay active.

Take the first letter from each animal you find when completing your brass rubbing, at the end it will make the name of an animal. (Hint: it is an amphibian and related to the name of this site!)

Scan the QR code on the wooden brass rubbing post and under 'Local Walking Routes & Maps' to download the route map for the Frog Lane Country Trail.

Wetlands and Hedgerow

The soil at the Wetlands is continuously saturated. The water retained in the soil provides a special ecosystem for wildlife and species, and is a great place for our newly planted hedgerows to grow and flourish.

We have planted British native species hedgerows including hawthorn, holly, spindleberry, field maple and alder buckthorn – enhancing biodiversity at the trail and providing habitat, food and shelter for our wildlife including bugs, insects, bees and butterflies.

Farming Activity and Livestock Crossing



The route of the footpath runs alongside working farmland, and there are parts of the footpath where there may be livestock or farming machinery crossing. Please be aware of the areas indicated by this symbol on the map, and take additional care in these areas to ensure that the path is clear and it is safe for you to proceed.

The trail is suitable for walking your dog, but we do ask that you please keep your dog on a lead at all times. Please act responsibly with extra special consideration for the farm animals in the adjoining fields and nearby farmland.

Water safety

Open water can be very dangerous, whatever the time of year. If you see someone in difficulty in the water, call 999 or 112 and ask for the fire service.
